Lesson	Topic	Details
1	Introduction to Writing Course and handwriting practice	Introduction to writing, review of nouns, verbs, adjectives, sentence structure and tenses. All grammar essential to be successful in writing.
2	Story Writing – Characters and Opening	Discover story writing, creating characters and how to structure your story (beginning, middle and the end of the story)
3	Story Setting	Think about what the story will be about, where the story will be located, the plot of the story, writing to create an image in the reader's mind and using emotive language.
4	Tension Writing for dramatic effect	Writing for tension, using language that creates tension for the reader.
5	Using Dialogue in Writing	Students create dialogue between characters, understanding speech marks and the correct punctuation used in dialogue writing.
6	Writing a Play Script	Understanding the features of a playscript (stage directions, characters, scene setting) and using them in writing.
7	Formal Letter Writing	Identifying formal and informal language and the subjunctive form. How to correctly write a formal letter.
8	Discussion Texts	To learn how to present information and arguments from different viewpoints. Using persuasive language, including the use of emotive words to understand how to write for arguments.
9	Poetry Writing	Acrostic Poetry is formed by writing a word vertically down the page. Students will use figurative language to write a 5-line acrostic poem.
10	Recount Texts	Understand what a recount is, write a story to recount some recent activity students have enjoyed as well as using the correct tense to write this.

11	Writing an Autobiography	Understand the format used to write a biography and build on understand of recount text. Students will write about events from their own life in autobiographical form.
12	Newspaper Texts	Exploring the features of Newspaper reports within examples. Write about a current topical event in a Newspaper report style.
13	Nonsense Poems	Learning different types of poetic conventions. Reading 'Jabberwocky' to explore how nonsense words are used in context. Students will try to write their own nonsense poem.
14	Persuasive Writing	Understanding the purpose of Persuasive writing and example texts. Students will become familiar with the conventions of AFOREST persuasive features and use them in their own writing.
15	Persuasive Writing - Big Write	Students will work independently and with support to write a non-fiction persuasive writing piece.
	Homework and Study Checks	During this writing course, pupils will be given some pre-reading exercises at the beginning of each lesson to help familiarize them with the style and tone of a specific text type before we start studying in class. Throughout the course, they will also be asked to continue creating their own different types of writing in their free time, and the teacher will review and give feedback on these.
