KS2 English Reading Skills	Develop the reading skills needed develop a firm foundation for secondary study. KS2 Vocabulary	This 10-lesson course is aimed at Key Stage Two level students in the final years of primary school. It will enable the students to build on their vocabulary skills and knowledge. The students will explore vocabulary in the context of non-fiction texts, fiction stories, poems and song. This will allow them to develop their understanding of language through reading, writing and creative strategies such as games and art.	Each lesson will begin with a starter activity 'Word of the Day' in which they will be given an ambitious word to discover the definition of, as well as the synonyms, antonyms and more. They will then move on to explore the theme of that lesson, along with a word list related to that theme. The student and teacher will work together to define this list. Then, read and understand a short story, extract or text together. This moves them onto a final writing task, completed with the support of the teacher. After each lesson the student will be required to submit a written task for homework using the same word list. Also, a task on the KS2 Next 200 High Frequency Words. These are words that appear most often in English writing	Ages 7-11

KS2 Creative Writing	<p>This exciting and enjoyable 15 lesson course is aimed at students in the final years of primary school. It covers skills from the National Curriculum Course for Key Stage 2 in the United Kingdom.</p> <p>The curriculum for this course includes a range of stimulus reading material to help students enjoy reading creative writing and to give them ideas and inspiration to create their own original creative pieces. The course includes opportunities for reading comprehension as well as creative writing, and there will also be literacy and grammar practice and tasks to practice using poetic devices. Students will also have plenty of scope to practice speaking and listening.</p>	<p>The course includes opportunities for students to read a range of creative writing examples, such as poetry and extracts from famous stories, and to write for audience and purpose. They will experiment with using a range of creative writing techniques and write their own poems, descriptions and stories. In the second half of the course students will read a short story by Roald Dahl, in order to study the techniques used, including a classic narrative arc structure. Students will then plan and write their own short story, and practise drafting and redrafting until a final piece is presented at the end of the course, which will be formally graded according to the criteria from the UK national curriculum.</p> <p>Each lesson starts with an introductory starter activity which will have a literacy, grammar or poetic technique focus. They will then read several kinds of texts and identify techniques which they can use to plan their own short pieces to complete at home. This foundation work will set them up for planning and writing their own original short story</p>	Ages 7-11
