## **MARVELous Heroes**

This course aims to develop students' knowledge, understanding and enjoyment of writing, and to meet National Curriculum, Key Stage 2 Framework requirements.

It is designed to make students confident and enthusiastic writers, using the superhero theme to engage and excite them as authors as they write their own superhero story.

They will plan their writing by discussing similar texts in order to understand and learn from the structure, vocabulary and grammar, recording their ideas.

They will practise organising their writing into paragraphs, creating a setting, characters and a plot for their own story. They will also be assessing the effectiveness of their own and others' writing as they go along, suggesting improvements and editing their work, proofreading for spelling and punctuation errors.
